## **Executive Director**

- Facilitate and champion key strategic partnerships that can help to better serve newcomers;
- Direct program planning, enhance mentoring opportunities, develop evaluation frameworks and identify and implement organizational priorities; and
- Identify trends, communities of practice and innovative possibilities that continue to impact the future of skilled immigrants.
