On behalf of the Toronto Region Immigrant Employment Council (TRIEC), I would like to congratulate you on your appointment as Minister of Citizenship, Immigration and Multiculturalism.

TRIEC is a multi-stakeholder council that convenes local leaders to find innovative solutions that connect skilled immigrants more effectively with the local labour market. We do this by working with a range of stakeholders to raise their awareness of the value of skilled immigrants, increase their acceptance to explore local solutions, and enhance their capacity to act.

While Canada may be facing tougher economic times ahead, it is even more important to take a long-term approach and invest in the areas that can reap future rewards. Skilled immigrants bring a wealth of experience and knowledge that Canada can leverage to grow the economy. But many skilled immigrants continue to be unemployed or underemployed.
